The Huntercombe Hospital Maidenhead



Huntercombe Hospital Maidenhead is a Tier 4 Child and Adolescent Mental Health (CAMHS) hospital for young people aged 12 to 18 years with a diagnosed mental health condition such as Bipolar Disorder or an Eating Disorder.

The hospital is set in a semi-rural location within the grounds of a 13th century manor house. It is conveniently situated in Taplow, just half a mile from junction 7 of the M4, three miles from Maidenhead and six miles from Windsor.

We have our own Ofsted registered school on site to ensure studies can continue during a young person's stay. We welcome young people, both male and female, aged between 12 and 18 years with a diagnosed mental illness such as:

- Bipolar Disorder
- Self-harm
- Anorexia Nervosa or Bulimia Nervosa
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Emerging Personality Disorder
- Mood Disorders
- Psychosis

We are also able to admit patients detained under the Mental Health Act 1983 (2007).

Our hospital is split into four separate wards split across three buildings: Kennet, Thames, Severn and Tamar. Each building has its own consultant led multi-disciplinary team and caters for young people with different care needs.



Eating Disorder Service Kennet ward (20 beds)

The setting for our eating disorder service is the original manor house. We aim to return patients to a healthy weight and to change the problem behaviours causing the eating disorder. We work closely with our families and carers to give our patients the best chance of recovery when they go home.

General Adolescent Unit Tamar ward (11 beds)

This ward is located in a separate building adjacent to the main manor house. It is suitable for those young people who have long-standing, complex mental health conditions who need some time in a safe environment to work through their issues.

Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) Thames (15 beds) and Severn (14 beds)

Located in a second building on the hospital site, Thames and Severn wards are for young people who are going through a sudden mental health crisis, and who pose a high risk to themselves or to others. These young people usually need immediate in-patient treatment in a secure setting to keep them safe. We work with the young people to draw up a treatment plan to help them achieve the best outcomes.

Overview

60 beds split over 4 wards

- CQC registered as an independent hospital and rated as "good"
- Ofsted registered school rated as "good" offering education from Key Stage 3 through to GCSE and A'Levels and advice on university applications and CV writing
- Four on-site consultant-led multi-disciplinary teams
- Individual therapy
- Group work includes psychotherapy groups (using a variety of models), skills orientated groups, recreational groups and community groups
- Large communal living spaces with flat screen TVs, Games consoles, DVD player, DVD library
- Leisure facilities including a gym
- Large modern kitchens for developing cookery skills in a relaxed environment
- On-site chefs who prepare fresh meals daily
- Large secure garden with all-weather sports pitch
- Activities and events programme for patients and families
- Minibus for appointments/outings

Our Care

Our well-established clinical team at Huntercombe Maidenhead is led by a Medical Director and Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist and Hospital Director. Each of our services has their own dedicated multi-disciplinary team unit comprising of a Consultant Psychiatrist, Associate Specialist and Unit Manager.

Other members of the multi-disciplinary teams comprise:

- Family Therapists
- Psychologists
- Physiotherapists
- Nursing and Support Staff
- Occupational Therapists
- Art Therapists

Our clinical team members are further supported by teachers, activity co-ordinators, administrators, housekeeping, catering and maintenance staff.

Our specialist teams work closely with local and national CAMHS community teams to provide a rapid, responsive and flexible service to help young people with challenging conditions.
